2011 COSF *Award Recipients*

Hoare Family Award

Zhan Wang received the £5,000 Hoare Family Award. He was born in Lanzhou in Gansu Province. The 23-year-old is pursuing an MJur in Law and attending St Hilda's College. Zhan earned his Bachelor of Law Degree at Renmin University of China in Beijing. He has received numerous scholarships and carried out volunteer work providing legal aid at various law firms in the Chinese capital. He has a special interest in corporate and financial law. In his view, China's market-oriented economy is still developing and is not immune to administrative and regulatory interference from the Chinese Government's planned economic policies. He believes the role of business lawyers is important to aid communities that might be inadvertently caught between these two systems in China. He hopes one day to establish a scholarship programme in China to help law students like himself to study abroad.

Wolfson China Scholarship

Vicky Ip received the £12,500 Wolfson China Scholarship. The 21-year-old is pursuing an MSc in Modern Chinese Studies and will be at Wolfson College. Vicky is a graduate of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. She earned her Bachelor's degree in Public and Government Administration and minored in Anthropology. During her undergraduate studies, she gained work experience in China at private Chinese educational consultancy firms that research China's local economies and policies. Vicky was also an active volunteer for numerous community programmes in Hong Kong, India, Cambodia and the Philippines. Her aim is to become a scholar on Hong Kong's social and political phenomenon and its dynamic and challenging relationship with the mainland Chinese Government. She aims to return to Hong Kong and work in policy formation in public administration for the Hong Kong Government.

Wolfson China Scholarship

Yuge Ma also received the £12,500 Wolfson China Scholarship. The 24-year-old is studying for a DPhil in Geography and the Environment and is at Wolfson College. Yuge was a £5,000 China Oxford Award winner last year. She is from Yuxi town in Yunnan Province in Western China. She earned her MSc degree in Contemporary India in the Department of Contemporary India Studies Programme at the School of Interdisciplinary Area Studies at Oxford. Yuge holds a Bachelor of Engineering degree in Building Science from the Architecture School and a BA degree in Law at Tsinghua University in Beijing. She secured an MA degree in Geography from the Centre for the Study of Regional Development at the Jawaharal Nehru University in New Delhi. Her aim is to become a future global leader and an eminent scholar on India and China in terms of their energy and climate policies and how these policies interact with social and political development.

Tang Oxford Award

Liang Kong received a £5,000 Tang Oxford Award for Environmental Sciences. The 25-year-old is from Nanjing in Jiangsu Province. Liang is a second year DPhil student studying Inorganic Chemistry at Oxford and is at St Hilda's College. Her area of study is in the sustainability of energy and the environment and she has carried out award-winning research work in chemistry and has presented her work internationally at conferences overseas. Her research focus is on solar energy. Liang is a graduate of Nanjing University where she earned a first class BSc degree in chemistry.

Tang Oxford Award

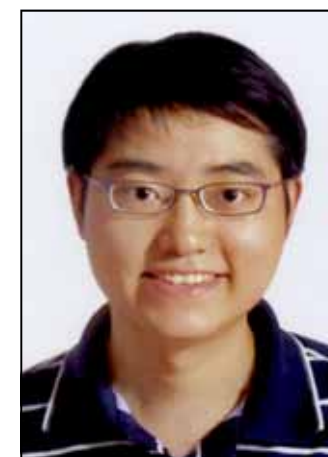
Feifei (Sophie) Deng also received a £6,500 Tang Oxford Award. This is the second year that Feifei has been the recipient of the Award. The 23-year-old is a second year DPhil student studying Oceanography in the Department of Earth Sciences and is at Wolfson College. Sophie is from Guiyang in Guizhou Province and she earned her BSc degree in Marine Chemistry from the Ocean University of China in Qingdao. Her research work is focussed on global carbon cycles and climate change. She would like to return to China to help develop innovative research and development in oceanographic work in the country.

Wei Oxford Award

Fei Yan received the £5,000 Wei Oxford Award. The 29-year-old is from Nanjing in Jiangsu Province. He is pursuing a DPhil in Sociology and is at St Cross College. Fei earned his BA degree in Sociology from Fudan University in Shanghai. He then attended Oxford University and earned his MSc degree in Comparative Social Policy. Fei continued his postgraduate studies at Stanford University where he earned his MA degree in East Asian Studies. His scholarly interests focus on political sociology, social movements and political transition in China. Fei has authored more than 150 articles which have been published in the Chinese media. His research on popular social and political movements resulted in the publication of two books.

Winkler Oxford Award

Xiao Wan received the £2,500 Winkler Oxford Award. She is a second year DPhil student at Oxford studying Biomedical Engineering. The 26-year-old is at Linacre College. Her current research project is developing three dimensional cancer models using tissue engineering and exploring their applications in the testing of new drugs and therapeutics. She plans to incorporate the use of stem cells into her research project during the latter course of her DPhil work. Upon completion of her studies, she hopes that she can contribute in the development of medical treatments for cancer and other diseases in China. Xiao is a graduate of Peking University where she earned both her BSc degree in Pharmacy and her MSc degree in Chemical Biology. Xiao is a native of Wuhan in Hubei Province.

Shan (Betty) Huang received a £10,000 William SD Louey Educational Foundation Scholarship. The 22-year-old was born in Henan Province and resides in Zhuhai. She will be pursuing an MSc degree in Financial Economics at the Said Business School. Shan is a graduate of Lingnan University in Hong Kong where she earned her Bachelor's degree in Business Administration. During her undergraduate studies, she was an exchange student for one year at Carleton College in Minnesota in the United States. Shan's interest is in China's financial market development and its internationalisation. She is also focussed on the promotion of business ties between mainland China and Hong Kong. 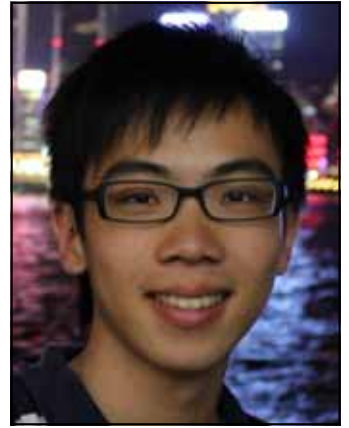

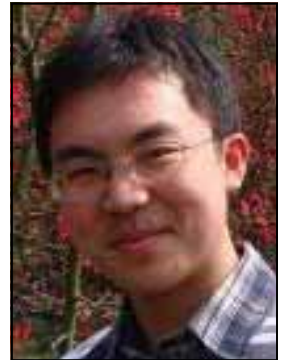

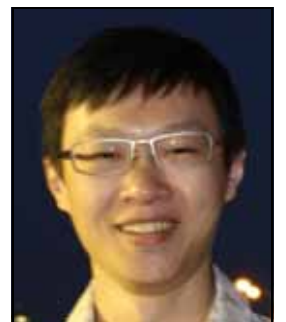
Yingqi Liu

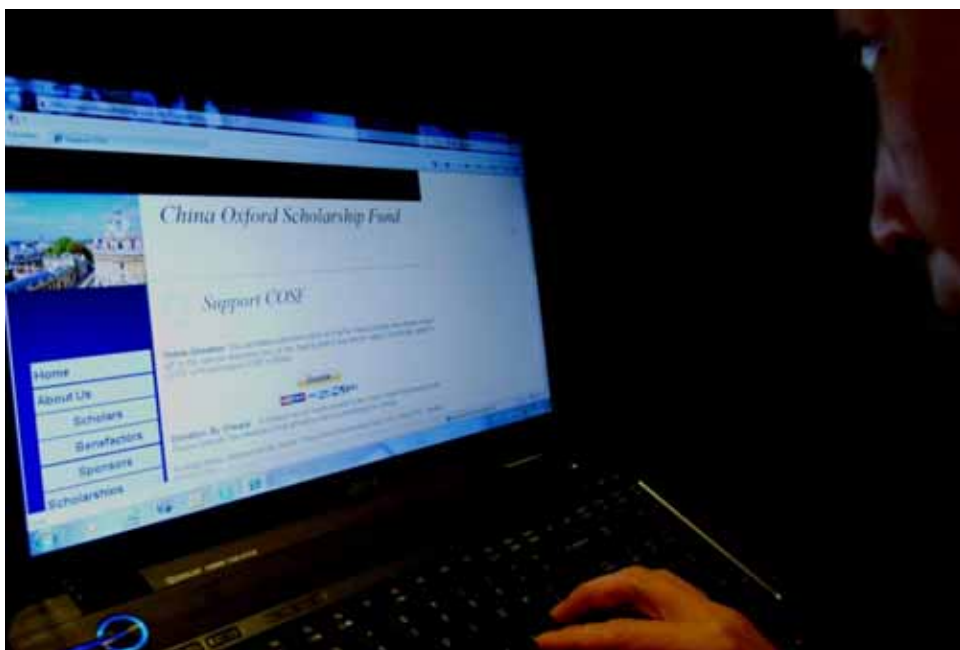
