# China Takes Centre Stage at Beijing Oxford Debate

In celebration of the 20th anniversary of the China Oxford Scholarship Fund (COSF), our Beijing Committee organised a successful launch of our first Beijing Oxford-style debate. The afternoon event took place on September 16, 2012 and was attended by Oxonians, COSF Scholars, Trustees, Committee members and supporters. The topic was "Will China Grow Without Stimulating External Hostility?". The debate drew more than 70 guests who gathered at the Western Returned Scholar Association's premises. "It was a great way to introduce this centuriesold and time-honoured Oxford tradition in China. It allowed so many Oxonians and COSF Scholars to engage in a robust discussion on China's global influence and role in the 21st century" said Zhe Zhang, one of the organisers of the debate. The event also provided an opportunity for COSF Scholars and Oxonians in Beijing to meet. COSF hopes more debates will take place in China and Hong Kong. Dear Friends,



The question of China's global influence was also debated at The Oxford Union with the Chancellor Lord Patten as the guest speaker on the topic, "Who Will Own the World in the 21st Century?". The Union event took place on October 12, 2012 with a full-house of students in attendance. Lord Patten noted that in his view, the major challenges China faces are tackling corruption, having an economic model that is less based on manufacturing export goods at cheap prices and trying to stimulate domestic consumption. He added it would not be in anyone's interest for China to do badly on any of these fronts. As for the question of to which country the 21st century belongs, Lord Patten said in an ideal world, he believes it would be a nation with a political system that had inclusive policies.



# 2012 COSF Award Recipients

**Brian Keelan Award** Junyuan Xue is this year's £16,000 Brian Keelan Award recipient. She is reading for an MSt in History of Art and Visual Culture and is attending University College. Junyuan is from Shanghai. She is a graduate of the University of Hong Kong where she earned her BA degree in Fine Arts. During her studies, she had the opportunity to spend time as an exchange student at Yale University in the United States and at the University of Heidelberg in Germany. Junyuan grew up in Shanghai and to prepare for her undergraduate studies at the University of Hong Kong, she spent one year at Fudan University. Upon completion of her studies at Oxford, her objective is to contribute to the development of the study of art history in China and to examine the role architecture might play within this discipline.





Hoare Family Award Meg Jing Zeng is the recipient of the £2,500 Hoare Family Award. She is reading for an MSc in the Social Science of the Internet at the Oxford Internet Institute. Meg is at St Hugh's College. She is a Chengdu native and earned her BA degree in International Communications from the University of Nottingham's Ningbo satellite campus in China. She graduated with First Class honours. During her undergraduate studies, she was able to travel to the United Kingdom to spend one year of studies at the University of Nottingham in Britain. She was a volunteer for several University-related initiatives such as the Students in Free Enterprise and the Chinese Society as well as travelling to Tunisia to help spearhead community educational activities in impoverished villages in the country. Her academic achievements have been recognised by the University of Nottingham in Ningbo where she was awarded the Dean's Scholarship for two consecutive years as well as the Provost's Scholarship during her first year of undergraduate studies.

**Tang Oxford Award** Yingqi Liu is the recipient of a £5,000 Tang Oxford Award. He is in his 2nd year of DPhil studies in Geography and the Environment. Yingqi is at St John's College. He is from Chongqing and he earned his BSc degree in Biological Science from Sichuan University in Chengdu. During his undergraduate studies, he was an exchange student at the University of Washington in Seattle where he earned a place on the Annual Dean's List. Yingqi has been a volunteer for several educational projects in China and has interned as a researcher in forestry for the Jinjyun Mountain National Nature Reserve. His interests involve examining the efficiency of Chinese environmental governance. Yingqi was the 2011 recipient of the £15,000 Dr Yungtai Hsu Scholarship offered at St John's College and the £1,000 China Oxford Honorary Award.

**Tang Oxford Award** Si Tan received the £6,500 Tang Oxford Award. She is reading for an MSc in Nature, Society and Environmental Policy and is at Linacre College. She is from Huzhou City in Zhejiang Province. Si earned her Bachelor of Management Degree from the China Agricultural University in Beijing. Her area of study was in rural development. During her undergraduate studies, she carried out field work looking into the water resource situation in Hebei Province and was a team leader in a field survey on sustainable living for farmers. The field survey was part of a Ministry of Education programme. Her academic achievements have been recognised through the awarding of several coveted scholarships available at the China Agricultural University. Si was a volunteer for Oxfam and the Mercy Corp in Beijing.

Wolfson China Scholarship Alex Xuan Wang is the recipient of the £12,500 Wolfson China Scholarship. Alex is reading for an MPhil in Economics and is at Wolfson College. He is from Nanchong in Sichuan Province and is a graduate of the University of International Business and Economics (UIBE) where he earned a first place ranking out of the 192 students in the department. His academic achievements have been recognised by the Chinese Government's Ministry of Education which awarded him over two consecutive years the coveted China's National Scholarship. Upon completion of his studies at Oxford, he would like to spend several years working at a development bank so that he can research social and economic issues of developing countries. His aim is to return to China's public sector where he hopes to play a role in helping the country to address its unbalanced economic development.

Wolfson China Scholarship Zhengyu He was also awarded a £12,500 Wolfson China Scholarship. Zhengyu is reading for a DPhil in Materials and is at St Anne's College. He is from Shanghai and is a graduate of Fudan University where he earned his BSc in Materials Science and Engineering. He was ranked within the top 5 per cent of his class. Zhengyu was active in several leadership roles at university such as being a student leader in the Physics Department at Fudan where he was responsible for managing a team to publicize the activities of the Department. He was also one of the leading members of the University's Student Union which supported the Shanghai Expo. He was a volunteer for the Sun Flower Organisation which helps senior citizens learn how to use computers and the internet.

**Wei Oxford Award** Ginny Jingyi Wang received the £5,000 Wei Oxford Award. She is pursuing an MSc in Financial Economics and is at Oriel College. She is from Tianjin. Ginny earned her BSc in Mathematics and Economics from Nanyang Technology University in Singapore. She was one of 80,000 Chinese students awarded the Singapore Government Full Scholarship to pursue her undergraduate studies in Singapore. Her interest is in environmental protection and this has sparked her desire to study financial economics with a focus on the environmental sector.


**Winkler Oxford Award** Paton Pak Chun Yam received the £2,500 Winkler Oxford Award. Paton is reading for a DPhil in Experimental Psychology and is at Lady Margaret Hall. Paton is from Hong Kong and graduated from Lingnan University where he earned his BSc with First Class Honours. He later attended the University of Hong Kong where he earned, with distinction, a postgraduate certificate in psychology. Paton continued his education at The Chinese University of Hong Kong where he completed his Master of Philosophy in Psychology. Paton was a volunteer for the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Lady Maclehose Centre as a tutor to mostly South Asian school children. He is also musically talented. He earned a Diploma in Piano Performance from the

Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music.

China Oxford Award Samuel Tsun Sum Tsang received a £5,000 China Oxford Award. He will be reading for an MSc in Applied Linguistics and Second Language Acquisition and is at Kellogg College. He earned his BA degree in English Studies as well as a Bachelor of Education degree in English Language. Samuel graduated within the top 10 per cent. He enrolled in an English Language Immersion programme in Australia at the University of Wollongong. He has been awarded numerous scholarships during his undergraduate studies as well as participating in student association and international conference activities.


China Oxford Award Ruiliang Liu received a £5,000 China Oxford Award. He is reading for an MSt in Archaeological Science and is at St Cross College. Ruiliang is from Shandong Province. He earned his BA in Preservation Science and Technology for Cultural Heritage from the Northwest University in Xian where he was ranked first place in his class. During his undergraduate studies, Ruiliang was a volunteer guide for various museums and temples in China. His conservation experience covers preservation projects for the Museum of the Terracotta Warriors and Horses for Qin Shihuang in Xian, the Guangzhou Opium War Museum and the Jinan Huayang Palace where he worked on preserving frescoes. His aim is to be an accomplished researcher in China in the area of cultural relics preservation.

Lilian Lingling Hu received a £1,000 China Oxford Award. She is studying for an MSc in Education and is at Lady Margaret Hall. She is a graduate of the University of Nottingham and its satellite campus in Ningbo in China. She earned her BA degree in English Language and Literature. Lilian is from Ningbo in Zhejiang Province and was awarded the Best Student of the 2008-2009 academic year as well as being awarded a Provost Scholarship. Lilian was involved in a number of extracurricular activities which earned her the Gold Award for two consecutive years in the University of Nottingham UK's School Representative Accreditation Scheme. Lilian was also recognised for her volunteer work with the UK charity vInspired. She hopes to play a role in the development and teaching of educational technology in China.

**China Oxford Award** Ken Gee Kin Ip was awarded a £1,000 China Oxford Honorary Award. Ken is from Hong Kong. He is reading for a Bachelor of Civil Law degree and is attending Corpus Christi College. Ken is a graduate of the City University of Hong Kong earning a Bachelor of Laws degree. During his undergraduate studies, he participated in summer law course programmes at the University of Oxford and Monash University in Australia. Ken is interested in playing a role in the advocating fair administration of justice and equality under law in China.

China Oxford Award Chang Liu was awarded a £1,000 China Oxford Honorary Award. She is reading for an MSt in Chinese Studies and is at St Antony's College. Chang is from Liaoning and she graduated from the East China Normal University in China. She earned her BA degree in History. Chang was awarded several scholarships such as the coveted China's Ministry of Education's National Scholarship as well as being recognised as the Best Student at the East China Normal University with Chang receiving for two consecutive years the Special Scholarship for Excellent Student. Chang's academic work will cover Chinese research and educational development during the Qing Dynasty in the 20th century. She believes there is room for raising more awareness in researching history and the humanities in China.



China Oxford Award Xin Zhang was also awarded a £1,000 China Oxford Honorary Award. Xin is reading for an MJur in Law and is at St Anne's College. Xin is from Jingjiang in Jiangsu Province and is a graduate of the Chinese University of Political Science and Law (CUPL) where she was on a full scholarship and was awarded her LLM in International Law. Xin also earned her BA degree in English at CUPL. Xin worked for three years as an assistant in the Office of Prosecutions at the International Criminal Court in The Hague in the Netherlands. This was after Xin participated in the first International Criminal Court Trial Competition which led to an internship and eventual employment. Upon completion of her studies, Xin would like to play a role in raising awareness of the importance of international criminal law in China.
