


- We were particularly delighted to receive the support of HSBC this year. I am grateful for the bank's involvement with our programme and we hope that it will be the beginning of an important partnership.



2009 Awards Process

The Fund's **Awards Panel** got off to a busy start with the 2009 application process. By mid-April, nearly 100 students applied to COSF's awards programme. This signified more than a 50 per cent increase compared with the number of those who applied last year. "The Awards Panel in 2009 followed the successful format of 2008, with five rounds of interviews, in Shanghai, Beijing, Hong Kong, Oxford and by telephone," said **Panel Chairman Rupert McCowan**. Two dozen students were shortlisted for interviews in **Shanghai** and **Beijing**. Five applicants were interviewed in **Hong Kong** while eight were interviewed in the **United Kingdom**. "The applicants, when interviewed, were of an excellent standard, leading to several difficult decisions for the Panel. One of the excellent improvements this year was the strong participation of the Shanghai and Beijing committees, who brought local knowledge both to the screening and interview processes" said Rupert.

Meanwhile, in Hong Kong, four new members joined the team. (Please see pages 4-5). The participating members of the 2009 Awards Panel are **William Louey, Kenneth Fok, Prof. Paul Tam, Sue Lau, Andrew Lo, Ronald Kwok, Dennis Ho, Dr Sharon Chan, Roland Muksch, Zhang Xing, Alastair Campbell, Will Chen, Peter Sunderland and Prof. Derek Siveter**. The Panel expects to nominate nearly two dozen students for awards this year. "We were delighted to be able to support another 21 applicants from greater China for the studies at Oxford this year" said Rupert. The award winners will be announced in COSF's Autumn Newsletter in October.



Scholar Diana Rong Hu's Address at the Summer Luncheon



Good afternoon, Ladies and Gentleman.

My name is Diana Rong Hu. It is a great honour and privilege for me to have this opportunity to speak on behalf of all the China Oxford Scholars. First of all, I would like to thank Mr and Mrs Beardson for their luncheon invitation and the China Oxford Scholarship Fund for the generous support to our studies in Oxford.

I am a DPhil student in Materials and I come from a small city in Gansu Province in the west of China. When I was a little girl, my father always told me to study hard; therefore I would have the chance to go to Tsinghua University in Beijing. The top university and the capital of China was really a huge temptation for a little girl. When I grew a little older my ambitions grew bigger too. I had hopes to continue my studies in the top universities in the world. Oxford, of course was one of them. Now I am studying in Oxford, the oldest and most prestigious university in the world. Sometime even I can't believe that I finally made my biggest dream come true. I am sure every scholar here can tell you a story of their own, about laughter and tears, about struggling and about our goals. Our generation is often called the "after 80s". There are many comments about us but without a doubt, our generation has had the happiest childhood since modern China was established. We have the right to pursue our own aspirations freely, which was not even possible for our parents.

Therefore, I would also like to take this opportunity to express my deep gratitude to China Oxford Scholarship Fund. It is only due to your kindness and efforts that many young Chinese students can live their dreams. The Fund is not only about financial support but also for spiritual support as it builds up such a warm family for all the friends of the Fund and the scholars. Talking about my life in Oxford and studying in the United Kingdom, I feel very British in some ways as I have complaints about the weather. But I have to say it is really a great pleasure to live and study in such a wonderful place, to be able to touch the marks left by all the great men and women so closely, to follow their footprints into the sacred hall of science. My supervisor, Prof. George Smith, is one of the founders of the atom probe tomography technique and a world leading scientist in nanostructure analysis. He is not only supervising my project to help me expand research experience into a whole new level but also always encouraging me to enjoy both science and life. He and his wife were very kind to invite me to join their Christmas family lunch. In my spare time, I even cycled along the ancient perimeter of Oxford University according to a map Prof. Smith drew. Our lab has a friendly international environment. We celebrate each other's birthdays; bake cakes in turn for the weekly group meeting; share ideas in science, culture and personal experiences. These opportunities have allowed me to benefit enormously by enabling me to expand my view and allow me to see life in a more colourful and different way. I am sure all of this will be an important step for me in developing my career in China as a material scientist.

This year on October 1st, the People's Republic of China will celebrate its 60th birthday. Since 1949, China has made extraordinary achievements and become one of the largest economies in the world, meanwhile it is also facing tremendous challenges. We are so lucky to be able to witness all the changes in China and have the chance to fulfil our dreams and hope to participate in these great challenges. However, China is still a developing country and there are young people who do not have the opportunities we have had. That's why I hope students like myself who have a background of studying abroad can pursue a career in China and bring back new ideas and help shape creative minds. We may not all become famous leaders and people, well at least not yet, but as long as everyone is willing to contribute no matter how small, I believe we can make a better future for China. Furthermore, we can help more children to make their dream come true within and outside of China. I think this is the spirit we all appreciate so much and it is something we hope to inspire and pass on to future generations in China.
