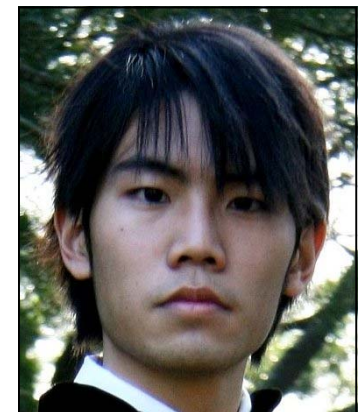
Johnny Hon China Scholarship

Brian Keelan Award

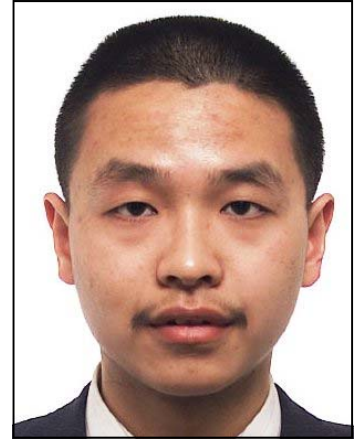

Tang Oxford Award

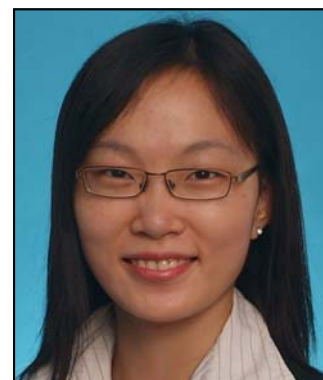
Wolfson China Scholarship

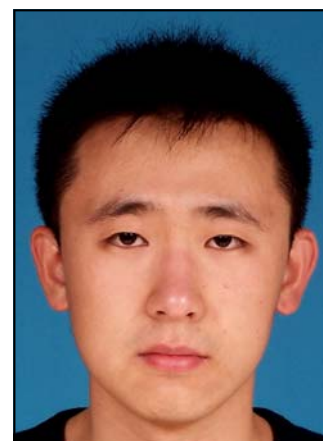

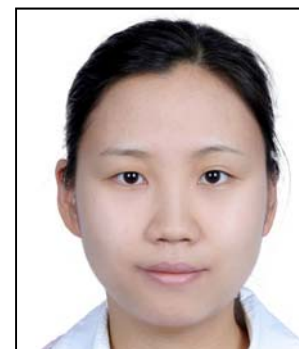
The following students each received a £5,000 China Oxford Award
