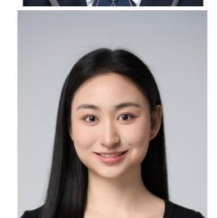
NUO CHEN - THOMAS WONG SCHOLARSHIP

Congratulations to Professor Michael Wooldridge who has been elected Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering. He is one of three Oxford academics to receive this honour this year. Prof. Wooldridge is an Ashall Professor of Foundations of Artificial Intelligence and Senior Research Fellow at Hertford College. He is one of 74 new Fellows recognised in 2025 for exceptional contributions to engineering and technology. The other two Oxford academics who have been elected are Emeritus Professor Ronald Roy and Professor Andrea Vedaldi from the Department of Engineering Science. Prof. Wooldridge is a former Chairman of the COSF Oxford Awards Panel, overseeing the application process and interviews from 2019 to 2023.

Well done to Dr Bryan Ng who was awarded the 2025 “Young Business Person of the Year” award from the Cherwell Business Awards in October. And recently, he was one of the “35 under 35” awardees of the National Recycling Awards. Bryan was a COSF Tang Oxford Scholar in STEM in 2021. He earned his DPhil in 2024 in Inorganic Chemistry and was at Trinity College. Bryan



was also an undergraduate at Oxford. During his doctorate studies, Bryan founded Repolywise, a start-up focusing on recycling plastics more efficiently and environmentally friendly. In January, his company received £375,000 of funding from Innovate UK for the development of the ‘Atomic Scissors’ technology. According to Bryan in an interview with *Oxford Calling*, “The “Atomic Scissors” technology, developed at the University of Oxford, involves a highly innovative process to break down waste plastics at the atomic level to selectively convert waste into propane”.
